Lithuanian press ban period from 1864 until 1904. During this time the press was allowed only in Russian. Lithuanian books were secretly spread by the book smugglers http://www.spaudos.lt/istorija/SD_issamiau.htm

In the 18th century there were three **Partitions of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth** conducted by Austria, Prussia and Russian Empire. They divided the Commonwealth's lands among themselves. Lithuania became a part of the Russian Empire.

3 May 1791 adoption of the first in Europe and the second in the world after the United States **written Constitution**. This Constitution was the main law of the **Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth**.

1765-1775 the first Lithuanian poem "METAI" ("The Seasons") was published. The author Kristijonas Donelaitis is considered to be the **pioneer of Lithuanian literature**. <http://www.donelaitis.info/>

The first printed book in Lithuanian language. Martynas Mažvydas "Katekizmas" ("Catechism") published in Königsberg in 1579. <http://www.šaltiniai.info/index/details/861>

1 July 1569 the Union of Lublin was signed. **Lithuania and Poland were joined together**. The compound of two countries was named the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth. It existed until 1795. http://lt.wikipedia.org/wiki/Liublino_unija

In 1410 Lithuania has achieved a victory in one of the largest medieval **Battle of Grunwald**.

In 1529 the **first Lithuanian Statute** was released. Later the second and the third Statutes were released in 1566 and 1588. These three Statutes formed the basis of the legal system of the Grand Duchy.

In 1387 **Lithuania was baptized** and changed from a pagan to a christian country. Zemaitija was baptized later in 1413

In the 13th century the Baltic tribes formed the nucleus of the **Lithuanian state**. It **became a state** during the reigning of King Mindaugas, who was crowned on 6 July 1253. King Mindaugas is considered to be a founder of the Lithuanian state.
